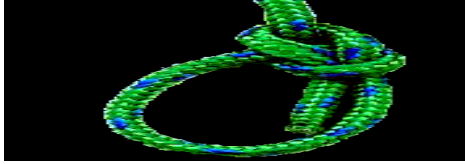
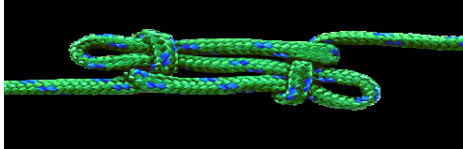


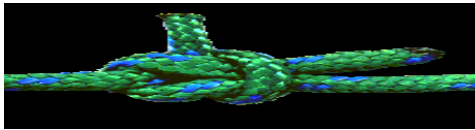
Square (or Reef) Knot Used to bind a package or bundle.



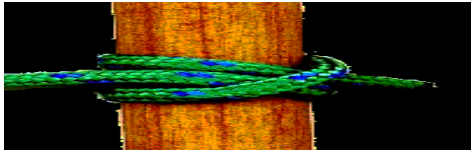
Bowline Used to make a non-slipping loop



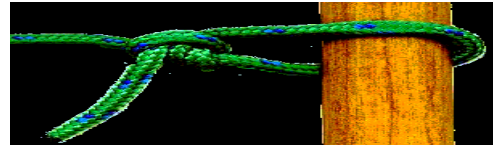
Sheep Shank Used to temporarily shorten a rope, or isolate a weak portion of rope.



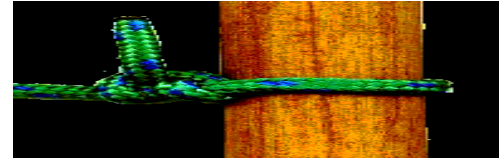
Sheet Bend Used to join two ropes together, which may be of unequal thickness.



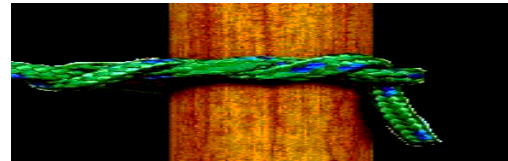
Clove Hitch used to start a lashing, or otherwise loosely attach a rope to a pole.



Taut-Line Hitch Used as a hitch, which may be drawn up away from what it is looped around to tighten a line.



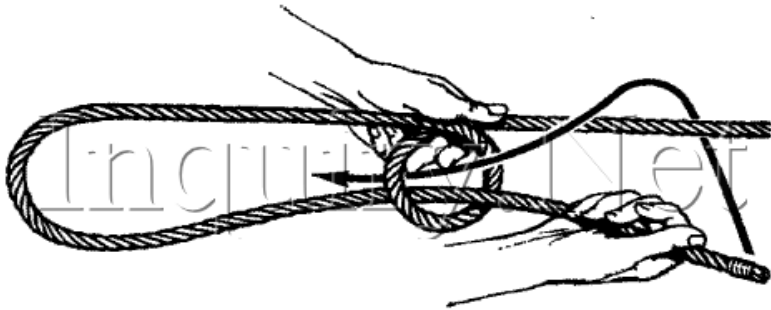
Two Half Hitches Used to attach a rope to a pole or guy point. Must be securely tightened.



Timber Hitch Used to attach a rope to a log for dragging.
